It's time for VVAC's annual Native American Ancestral Garden Open House! This year, we have moved the date up by two months to avoid the extreme Summer temperatures. Our pollinator garden is already blooming with Periwinkle, California Poppy, Larkspur, and Desert Daisies. Another promising treat is our relatively new permaculture garden, which demonstrates the 'Land Race' gardening technique of establishing species most adaptable to the conditions. These plants include cotton, sunflower, red die amaranth, and onions. In past years, the 'three sisters' of corn, squash, and beans are favorites, but they may just be sprouting in May this year.

Join Rob Estrada, VVAC's Ethnobotanist as he presents the benefits and pitfalls of a permaculture garden and Native 'three sisters' farming. Guests are encouraged to start their gardens with sprouts of yellow squash and local floral varieties that will be available for sale the morning of the open house.
